

The number of female candidates is lower than male candidates, there are more BAME than white candidates. The number of non-UK trainees is higher than number of self-declared UK trainees.







Candidate performance

Candidate numbers have increased for 23-3. Pass rates for all groups are in line with pre Covid diets.


Female candidates have a higher pass rate than male candidates, white candidates are passing in a higher proportion than BAME candidates and UK trainees have a higher pass rate than those not in UK training (Note: data on training is self-declared).



Candidate scores distribution shows most candidates scoring between 108 and 139 (mean=132, stdev=19.2, median=133, mode=137). UK trainees had a mean score of 135 and stdev = 18.1 (median = 138, mode= 140). The pass mark is established at **126** and candidates also have to pass all skills.









Skills and Encounters performance

For all candidates skill B has the lowest pass rate, 63.7%, while skill G has the highest pass rate, 99.4%. UK trainees are passing skill B in proportion of 67.9%, while the highest proportion is for skill G, 99.5%.









<u>All candidates</u>: skill G has the highest proportional average score (31.7/32; 99.2%) whereas skill B has the lowest proportional score (15.0/24; 62.4%) and these are consistent with historical data. The Communications 1 and 2 encounters have the highest proportional mean score (13.8/16; 86.1%) and the Neurology encounter has the lowest (14.6/20; 73.1%).


<u>UK trainees</u>: skill G has the highest proportional average score (31.8/32; 99.4%) whereas skill B has the lowest proportional score (15.6/24; 64.9%) and these are consistent with historical data. The Communications 1 and 2 encounters have the highest proportional mean score (14.2/16, 89.0%; 14.3/16, 89.5%) and Neurology encounter has the lowest (14.4/20; 71.8%).


