

Specialty Certificate Examination (SCE) in Acute Medicine 2022 Selected Examination Metrics

The 2022 SCE in Acute Medicine was sat in November 2022 by 318 candidates of whom 91 were self-declared UK trainees. From 2022 'OTH' self-declared UK trainees are excluded from UK trainees' cohort. Candidates who did not declare their training details and the OTH group are reported as 'Other' (227).

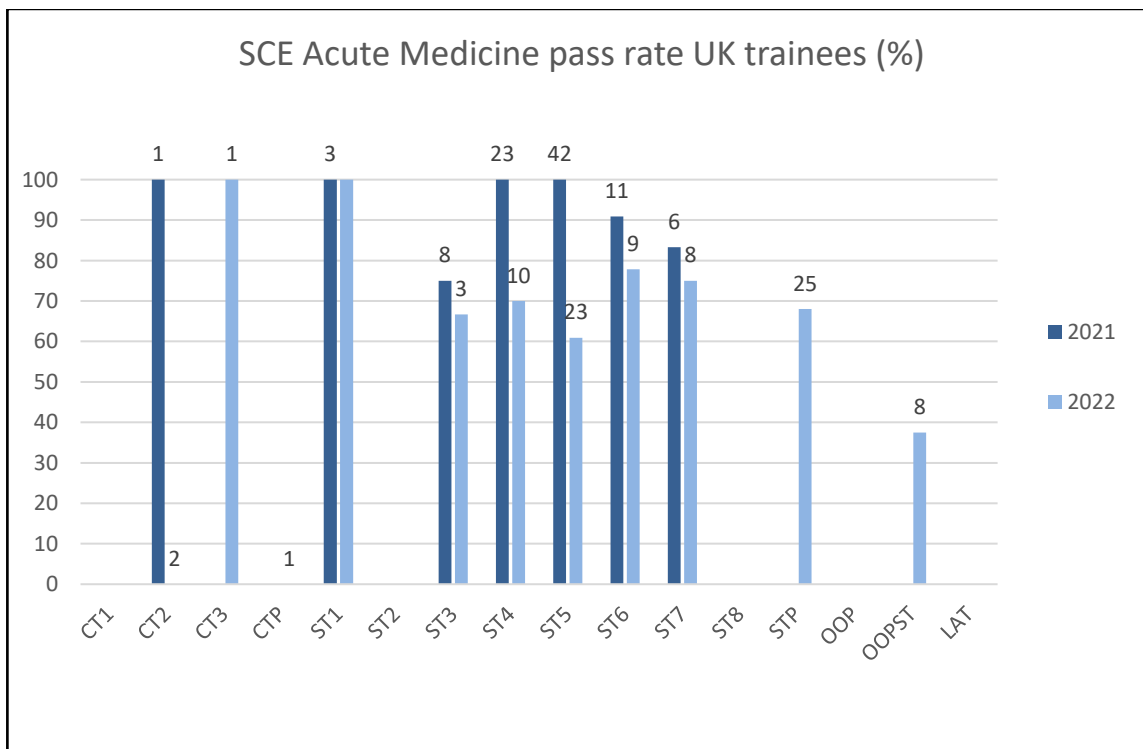
Pass Mark

The pass mark for this examination was established by equating based on 2019 UK trainees' performance after excluding OTH group. The standards of the examination were reviewed in February 2022 and the pass score was increased from 449 to **493**. All future examinations will use 493 as the passing score until the standards are reviewed by the SCE Acute Medicine Examination Board.

For the 2022 SCE Acute Medicine examination the pass mark was set at **493 (61.5% or 123/200)**.

UK trainees' performance

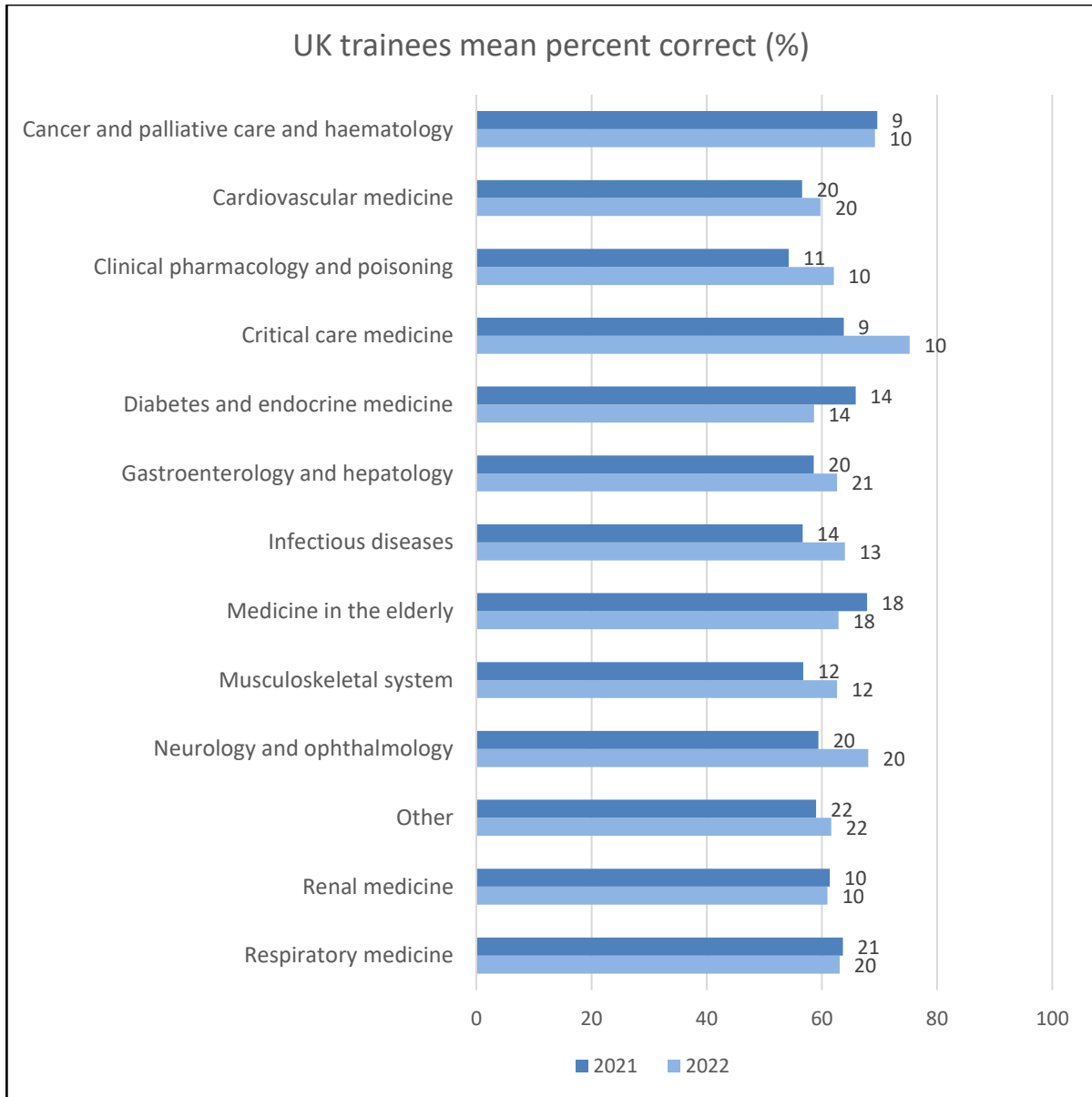
In 2022 the highest number of sitting UK trainees was in ST5 (23) with a pass rate of 60.9%. Pass rate for all UK trainees was 63.7% and for all candidates the pass rate was 45%.



Note: The numbers at the top of the bars are the number of sitting trainees

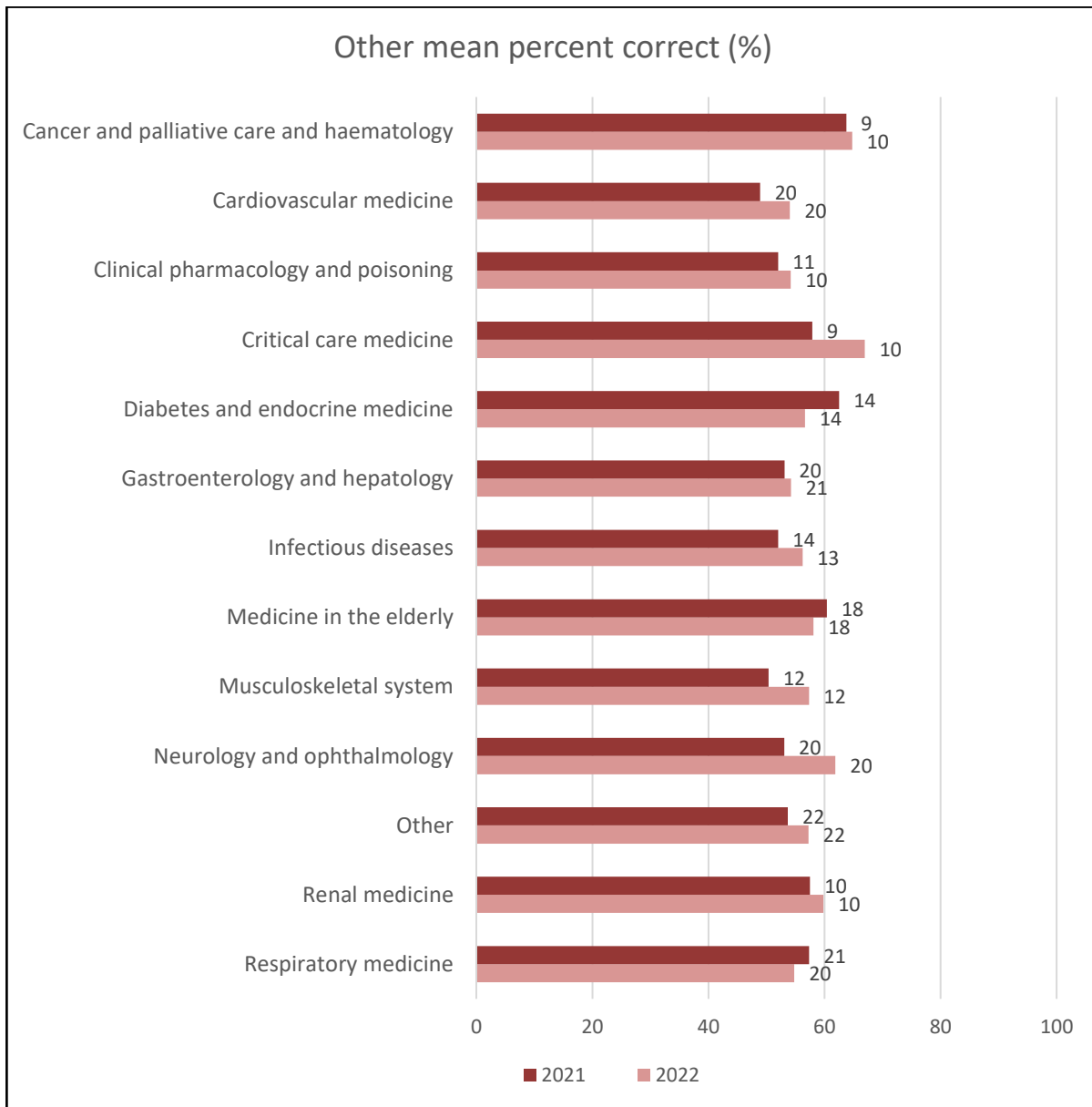
Topic performance

In 2022 UK trainees have the highest percent correct in Critical care medicine and the lowest in Diabetes and endocrine medicine.

Other candidates have the highest percent correct also in Critical care medicine and the lowest in Cardiovascular medicine and in Clinical pharmacology and poisoning.
