Along with the responsibility for chairing the Scenario Editorial Committee three times a year the Chair of the Scenario Editorial Committee will also be a member of the MRCP(UK) Clinical Examining Board, which meets three times a year.

Applicants should meet the following criteria to be eligible to apply: Member or fellow of one of the Royal Colleges of Physicians of the United Kingdom Be registered with a licence to practise and in good standing on the GMC specialist register Be actively engaged in the training of junior doctors in the UK (or within the last two years) Be up-to-date as appropriate with relevant national guidelines, CPD requirements, employer's equality and diversity training, and appraisal process.

This is currently a non-salaried position and all reasonable expenses and travel costs will be met by the MRCP(UK) Central Office in line with the Federation expenses policy. The tenure of appointment is five years.

Applicants should submit a brief outline of their professional training, together with a resume of their commitment to medical education and training, and their specific expertise in the MRCP(UK) Diploma with details of two referees.
