

European Speciality Examination in Gastroenterology and Hepatology 2019 Selected examination metrics

The 2019 European Speciality Examination in Gastroenterology and Hepatology (ESEGH) was sat by 490 candidates of whom 141 were self-declared UK trainees. Candidates who did not declare their training details and who also took their exams in centres outside Europe are reported as 'Other' (193). 156 candidates sat in European centres and they are reported as European candidates.

ESEGH is a joint exam where the Specialty Certificate Examination (SCE) in Gastroenterology and the European Section and Board of Gastroenterology and Hepatology Examination (ESBGHE) became a single examination. It was first sat in 2018.

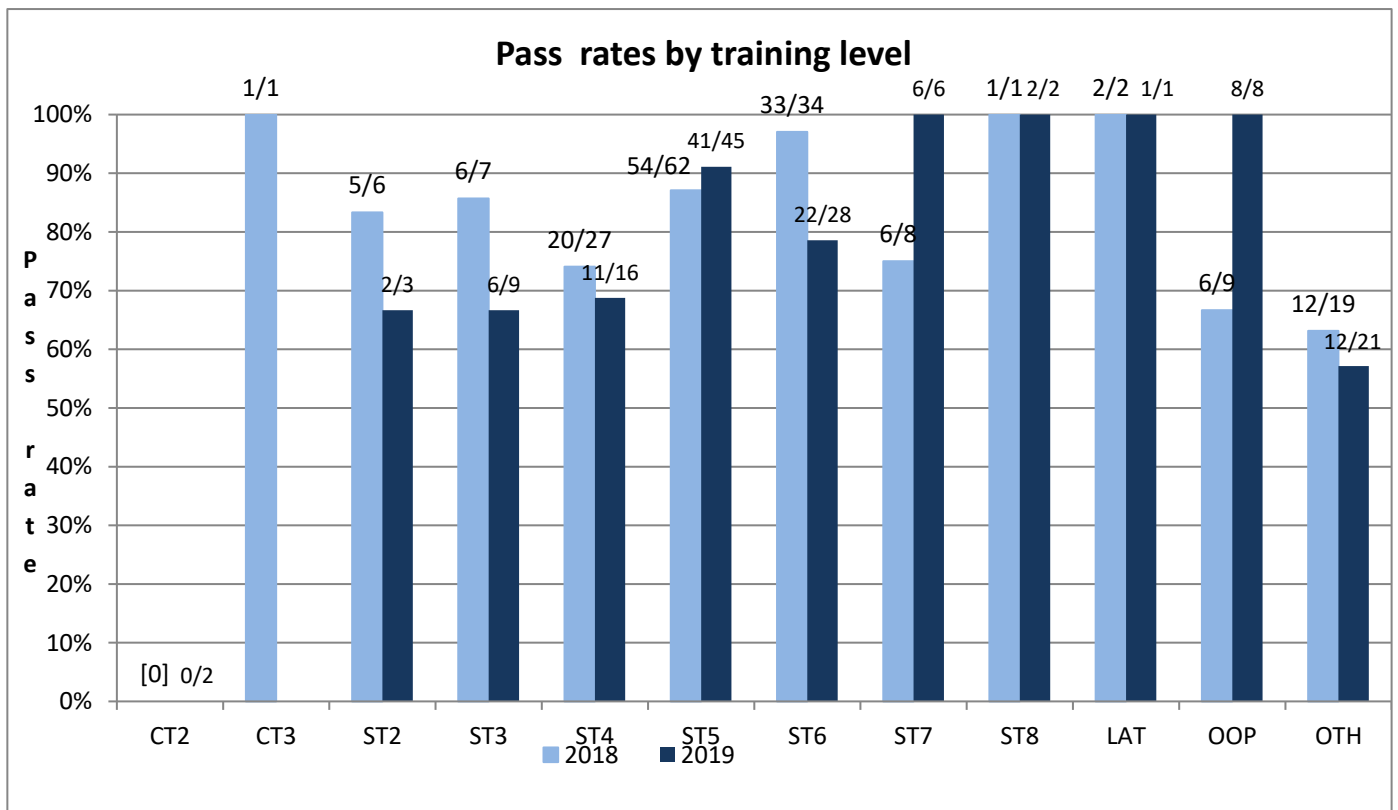
Pass Mark

The pass mark for this examination was established by using the Hofstee compromise method which combines the mean scores of the standard setting group with UK trainees' performance.

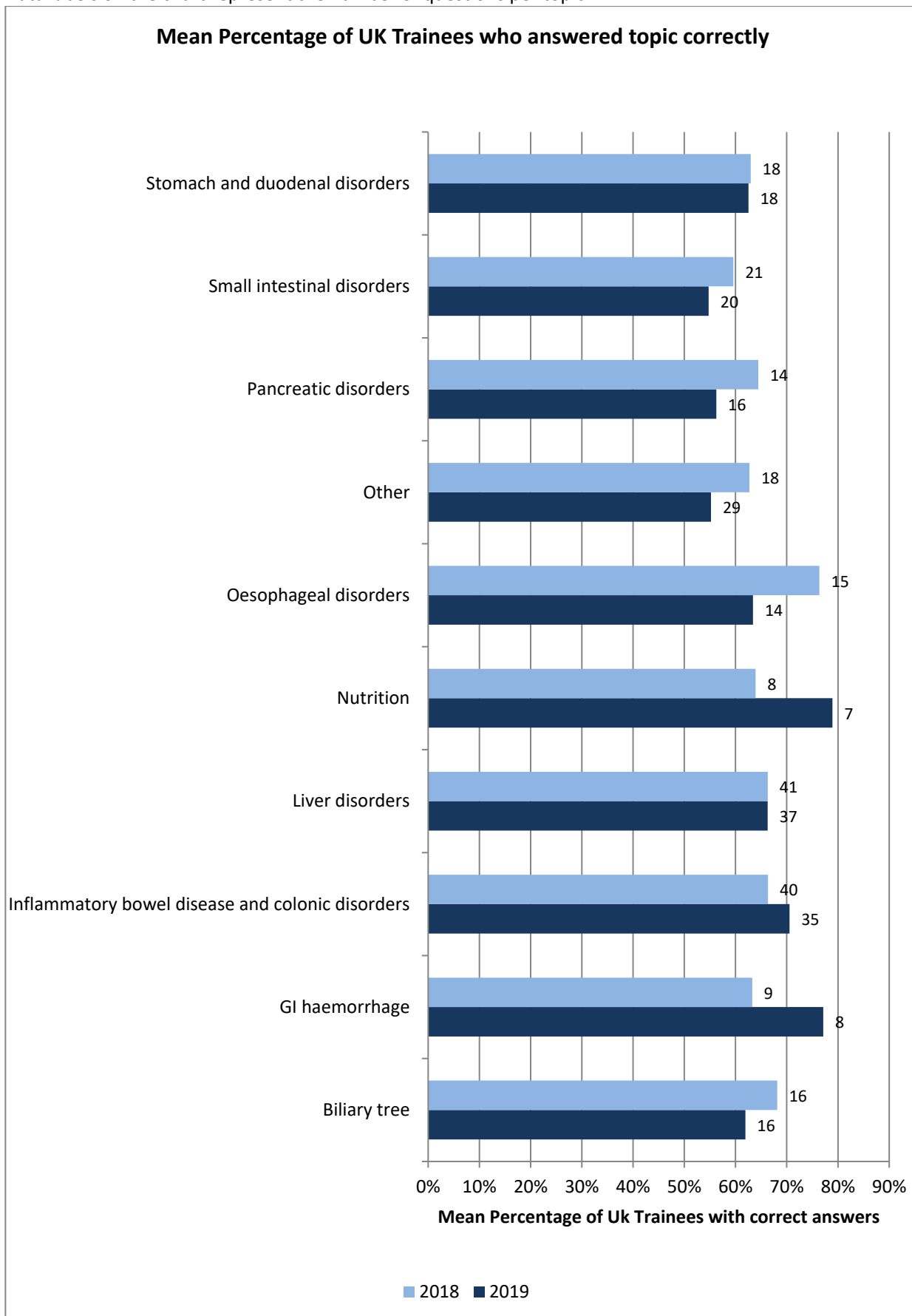
For the 2019 ESEGH examination the pass mark was set at 59% (118/200).

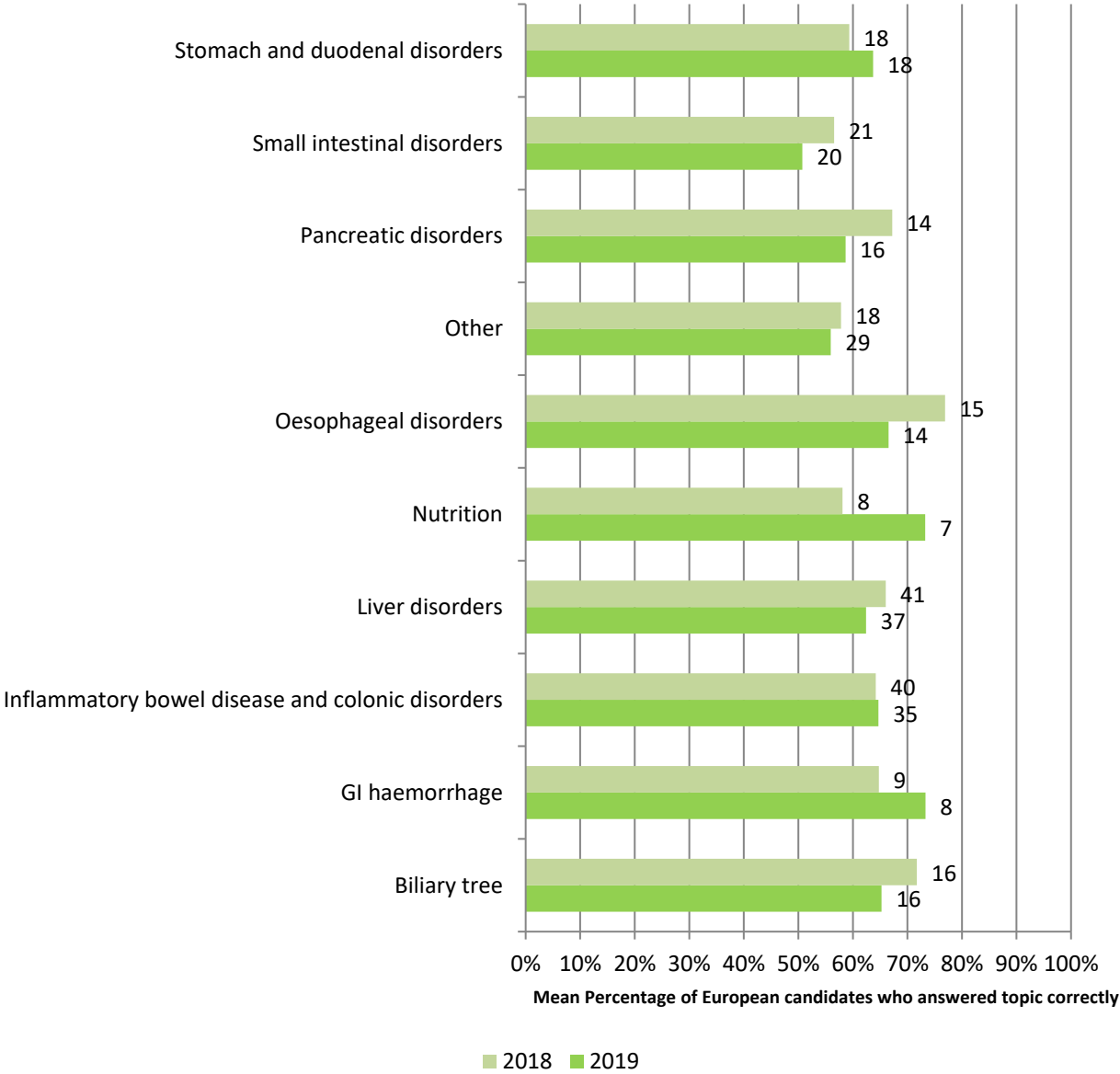
The numbers at the top of the bars are the number of trainees passing/sitting
