

European Speciality Examination in Gastroenterology and Hepatology 2020 Selected examination metrics

The 2020 European Speciality Examination in Gastroenterology and Hepatology (ESEGH) was sat by 332 candidates of whom 149 were self-declared UK trainees. Candidates who did not declare their training details and who also took their exams in centres outside Europe are reported as 'Other' (102). 81 candidates sat in European centres and they are reported as European candidates.

ESEGH is a joint exam where the Specialty Certificate Examination (SCE) in Gastroenterology and the European Section and Board of Gastroenterology and Hepatology Examination (ESBGHE) became a single examination. It was first sat in 2018.

Pass Mark

The pass mark for this examination was established by equating based on 2019 UK trainees' performance. All future examinations will use 2019 as the base form for equating until the standards are reviewed by the SCE ESEGH Examination Board.

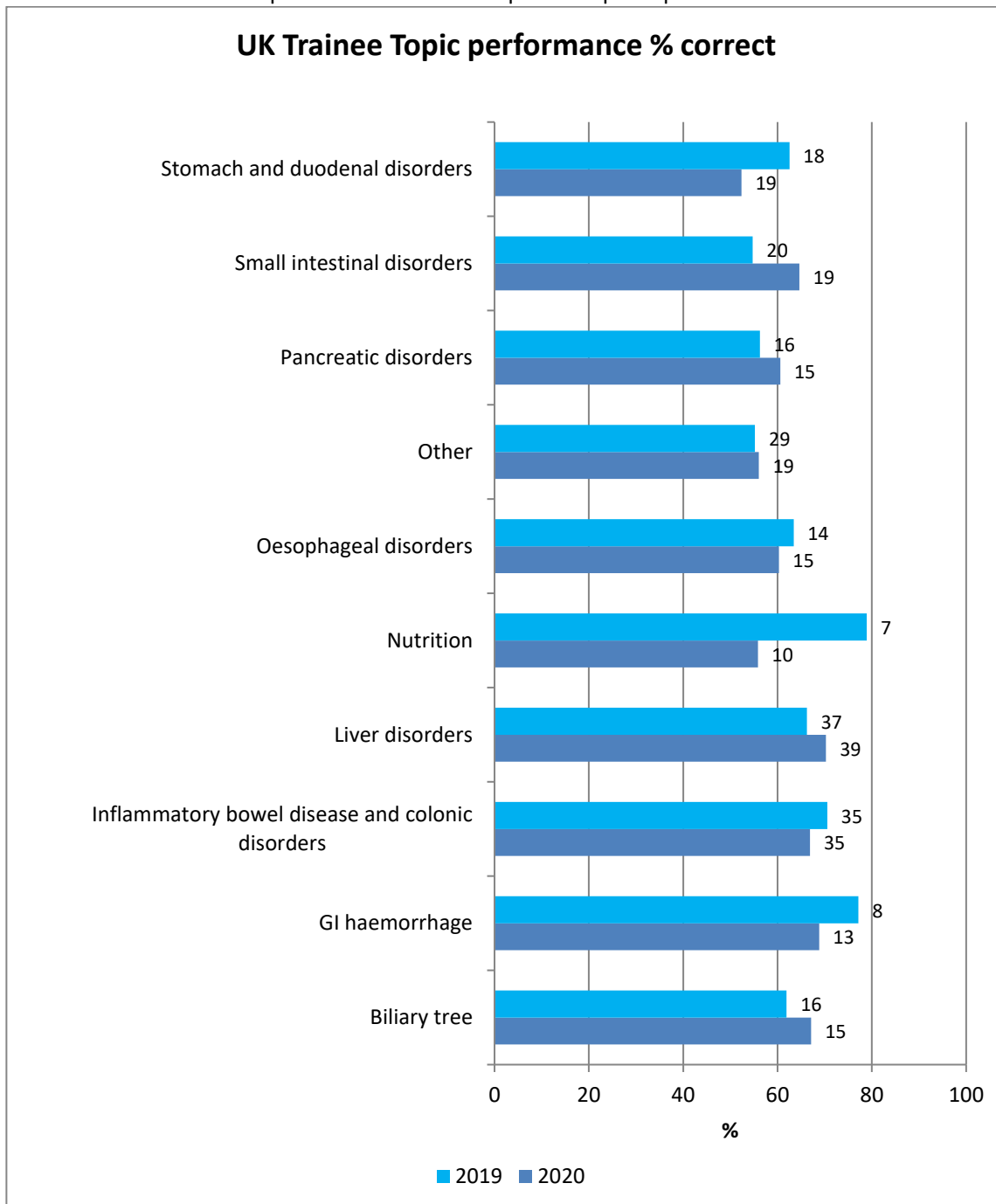
For the 2020 ESEGH examination the pass mark was set at **432 (61.3% or 122/199)**

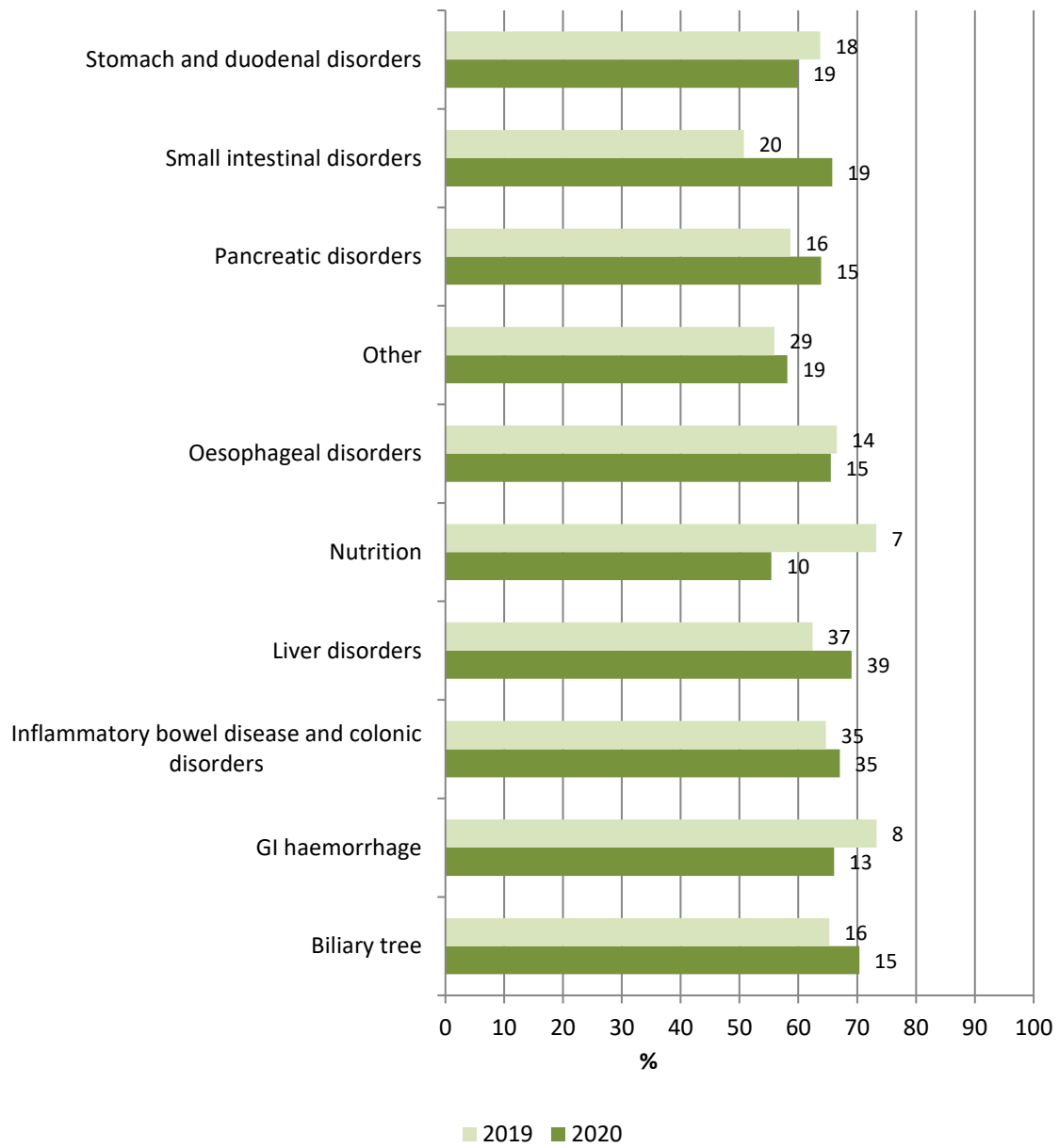
The numbers at the top of the bars are the number of trainees passing/sitting
