

## Vacancy: Chair of the MRCP(UK) Part 2 Written Examining Board

The Federation of Royal Colleges of Physicians of the UK is seeking to appoint a Chair of the MRCP(UK) Part 2 Written Examining Board.

The successful applicant will have overall responsibility for the clinical and academic leadership of the Part 2 Written Examining Board and for the on-going development of the Part 2 Written Examination in the context of the overall development of the MRCP(UK).

The person appointed will be a Fellow of one of the Royal Colleges of Physicians of the UK, with a license to practise, and practising in a medical specialty.
